

The reference format of SFP English journals is referenced from MDPI ACS journals. Authors can use the endnote format of SFP to cite literature.

1. Citation

References should be numbered sequentially in numbers. Reference should be cited in the text in form of "[x]", for example [1-4] or [3, 5-7]. Reference with a DOI must provide the DOI at the end of the document. Note: The same reference is numbered only once, corresponding to the unique reference number. When the same reference appears multiple times in the text, cite the first occurrence of the serial number directly in the text.

2. Types of References

- Journal/Periodical Articles
- Books
 - With editors
 - Without editors
- Conferences or Meetings
 - Proceedings
 - Oral presentations without published material
- Website/online resources

3. Journal/Periodical Articles

Format:

Author 1; Author 2; Author 3; etc. Title of the article. *Journal Abbreviation* Year, Volume, Firstpage–Lastpage, doi:prefix/suffix.

Examples:

Díaz, D.D.; Converso, A.; Sharpless, K.B.; Finn, M.G. 2,6-Dichloro-9-thiabicyclo[3.3.1]nonane: Multigram Display of Azide and Cyanide Components on a Versatile Scaffold. *Molecules* 2006, 11, 212–218, doi:10.3390/11040212.

4. Books

4.1 Books with editors

Format:

Author 1; Author 2; Author 3; etc. Title of the contribution. In *Title of the Book*, Edition (if available); Editor 1, Editor 2, Eds.; Publisher: City, Country, Year; Volume (optional), pp. Pages (optional), ISBN XXX-XXX-XXX-XXX-X.



Reference List and Citations Style Guide for English Journals of SFP

Examples:

Dodd, J.S.; Solla, L.; Bérard, P.M. References. In *The ACS Style Guide*, 3rd ed.; Coghill, A., Garson, L., Eds.; American Chemical Society: Washington, DC, USA, 2006; Volume 1, pp. 292–325, ISBN 978-0-8412-3999-9.

4.2 Books without editors

Format:

Author 1; Author 2; Author 3; etc. *Title of the Book*, Edition (if available); Publisher: City, Country, Year; Chapter (optional), pp. Page range (optional), ISBN XXX-XXX-XXX-XXX-X.

Examples:

Desiraju, G.R.; Steiner, T. *The Weak Hydrogen Bond in Structural Chemistry and Biology*, 2nd ed.; Oxford University Press: New York, NY, USA, 1999; pp. 10–25, ISBN 978-01-9850-970-7.

5. Proceedings

Format:

Author 1; Author 2; Author 3; etc. Title of Presentation. In Proceedings of the Name of the Conference, Location of Conference, Country, Date of Conference (Day Month Year); Abstract Number (optional), Pagination (optional).

Examples:

Chum, O.; Philbin, J.; Zisserman, A. Near duplicate image detection: Min-Hash and tf-idf weighting. In Proceedings of the 19th British Machine Vision Conference (BMVC 2008), Leeds, UK, 1–4 September 2008; pp. 812–815.

6. Oral presentations without published material

Format:

Author 1; Author 2; Author 3; etc. Title of Presentation (if any). Presented at the Name of Conference, Location of Conference, Country, Date of Conference; Paper number (if available).

Examples:

Zhang, Z.; Chen, H.; Zhong, J.; Chen, Y.; Lu, Y. ZnO Nanotip-based QCM Biosensors. Presented at the IEEE International Frequency Control Symposium and Exposition, Miami, FL, USA, June 2006.

7. Website and Online Resources

Format:

Author (if available). Title of the webpage (if available). Available online: <http://...> (accessed on date).

Examples:

International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry Home Page. Available online: http://www.iupac.org/dhtml_home.html (accessed on 24 April 2005).
